CYBERBULLYING AWARENESS SEMINAR

On 22nd July 2025, a cyber safety awareness seminar was conducted for students of Classes 7 and 8 by Mrs. Vandana Abraham, Principal and Director of Timpany School.

In her gentle and engaging manner, Ma'am spoke about the growing risks of the digital world and stressed the importance of delaying phone ownership to the age of 15, a rite of passage that helps protect young minds from online harm. Ma'am also explained how cyberbullies can exploit innocence by circulating inappropriate images or hurtful comments, which can severely impact a child's confidence and self-worth. She encouraged students to be alert and to always share such incidents with a trusted adult, block such bullies, and prioritize their mental well-being. The session also covered the emotional effects of cyberbullying such as anxiety, depression, and even self-harm and how early help and the right choices can lead to a safe and happy online life. At the end of the session, the students shared their thoughts and



experiences with many expressing how inspired they felt to take better care of themselves and their peers in the digital space.

CLASS 2:

LKG Shapes Day!



CLASS 6

As part of the topic Physical Quantities and Measurements, students of class 6 from Timpany School were introduced to a new instrument—the metre scale. They used it to measure the height of various objects and learned how to take accurate measurements. Through hands-on activity, they also understood the concept of parallax error and how it affects accuracy. The activity helped them develop observational skills and apply measurement techniques with care and precision.







Class 9

Warli Art, a traditional tribal art form from Maharashtra, can be effectively integrated into various academic projects. This folk art, characterised by simple geometric shapes such as circles, triangles, and squares, is used to represent nature and human activities in a village setting, often depicting festivals, celebrations, and daily routines. It offers natural integration with subjects such as Mathematics and History. As part of the activity, students engaged in pencil drawing and sketching to creatively and precisely recreate Warli patterns.

CLASS 10

Class 10 students of Timpany School observed a demonstration on experiments related to photosynthesis as a part of their Biology lesson. The session illustrated key concepts such as the role of sunlight, carbon dioxide, and chlorophyll in the process. This hands-on demonstration helped strengthen understanding through visual and practical learning.



CLASS 11

Class 11 students of Timpany School conducted a titration experiment in the chemistry laboratory as part of a classroom activity. The objective was to determine the molarity of an unknown solution through careful analysis and observation. The activity provided valuable insight into real-world chemical applications and precision in experimentation.





CLASS 11

Class 11 students of Timpany School conducted a simple pendulum experiment as part of their Physics Practicals to calculate the acceleration due to gravity at their location. They carefully measured the time period for different lengths of the pendulum and applied the standard formula to find the value of 'g'. The experiment was successfully carried out, and the students obtained a result very close to the expected standard value, demonstrating accuracy in their observations and calculations.



CLASS 6

Classroom Activity on Flower – A Learning Experience

To make the topic of flowers more engaging and interactive, a hands-on activity was conducted in the classroom. Students were given fresh flowers of hibiscus. During the activity, they carefully observed and dissected the flowers to identify and label different parts—sepals, petals, stamens, and pistils. The activity helped reinforce theoretical knowledge in a fun and practical way, encouraging curiosity and participation. Overall, this flower activity enhanced students' understanding of the topic and made the learning process more enjoyable and memorable.


STEM WORKSHOP

The 3-day STEM labs Teacher Training Programme was conducted at Timpany School, Visakhapatnam, from 15th to 17th July 2025, for Computer Science and AI-Robotics teachers from all three Timpany Schools. A total of 14 teachers participated actively. On Day 1, the training began with the segregation of components for five lab setups and equipment verification. Teachers were introduced to core STEM and Robotics concepts, followed by an overview and demonstration of all the DIY kits provided. The hands-on activity with the STEAM Paper Circuit Kit—Study Time Circuit—sparked interest and engagement among participants.

Day 2 included hands-on sessions using various kits such as the Smart Circuit Kit (LED control and motor circuits), Basic Breadboard Kit (resistors and seven-segment displays), Tinker & Design Kit (3D pen prototyping), Mechatron Kit (table fan with remote control mechanism), and a module on using a multimeter to measure voltage. On the final day, teachers learned how to use the LMS platform to manage lessons, assignments, and student interaction. In the AIConnect session, they explored coding and DIY kit programming through simple AI and image detection projects. Using Micro: bit, they created fun projects like Digital Dice and LED patterns with block-based coding. In the 3D Printing module, teachers learned how 3D printing works, designed small objects like keychains and boxes, and successfully printed a 3D boat model. The training ended on a positive note with enthusiastic participation from all teachers.



STEM LAB WORKSHOP - TSSS & TSCS (AI & ROBOTICS)



In our commitment to fostering innovation and 21st-century skills among students, Timpany Schools recently facilitated specialised training for the Science and Math faculty in the use and implementation of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) labs, conducted by Mr. Bambino Clansman and the Yahweh Team, focusing on training teachers in the areas of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Robotics. The sessions were held across both Timpany Senior Secondary School and Timpany Steel City School from July 15–17, 2025. 


The kids were thrilled to show off their paper creations and proudly posed with smiles. It was a fun-filled session that turned simple paper into imaginative play!


- · Amoeba engulfing its food




